Our last year at Central was set off by choosing Jim Edelen as President; Roberta Bair as Vice-President; Remelda Selan as Secretary and Romona Conner as Treasurer. We sent Pat Beckley and Loren Sims to Student Council. Mr. Stout was chosen class sponsor. We changed our colors to Blue and Gold; our flower to the White Rose; and the motto to "The higher we climb, the broader the view."

Early in the year we donned our War Bonnets and dealt the Sophomores misery on Red and White Day. We selected Nola Christensen as our class queen. Who can forget Hush Day and Sneak Day? And the Prom, need a warrior say more for it? Baccalaureate and Commencement left this tribe of warriors and maidens sad but happy.
